What is TITLE III?

The Strengthening Historically Black Colleges and University Program, referred to as Title III, is funded under the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended. The Higher Education Act was legislation signed into United States law on November 8, 1965 as part of President Lyndon B. Johnson's Great Society agenda to provide financial assistance to Historically Black Colleges and Universities and assist these institutions in establishing and strengthening their physical plants, academic resources, fiscal management, and endowments, so that they may continue to participate in fulfilling the goal of equality of educational opportunity.

Funds are allocated by a formula which is based upon the number of Pell Grant recipients at the institution; the number of bachelor degree recipients of the institution; and the number of students who graduated from the institution and have been admitted to, and are in attendance at a graduate or professional school. Currently, there are approximately 106 HBCUs and countless students benefiting from Title III federal funding.
