



Eligibility

The minimum qualifications for admission consideration into the Keystone Honors Academy include:

- 3.0 GPA (freshmen)
 - 3.5 GPA (transfer students with at least 30 credits)
 - Minimum SAT Score of 1080 or ACT score of 21*
- * Transfer students do not have to submit SAT/ACT scores

Admitted students are then considered for a number of competitive scholarship awards. Packages are made up of both private and public scholarships, and designed to support in-state and out-of-state students.
